BACHELOR'S DEGREE <sup>of</sup> IN e-COMMERCE

1. Name of the degree :- Bachelor's degree <sup>of</sup> in e-Commerce.
2. It is an integrated three years degree course.
3. This course shall follow semester pattern i.e. there shall be six semesters in three years.
4. Need :- The present age of information technology has made a sweeping impact in the areas of Trade, Commerce and Industry. The use of electronic media has overriding impact in all the fields. So study of basic courses of Commerce, Management and Economics alone is not sufficient. The students of Commerce and Management must be well-equipped with the knowledge of computers and different facets of E-Commerce. Functional proficiency, in the field of computers programming skills and knowledge of cyber laws is necessary for a commerce graduate if he has to stand successfully to the pressures of present needs of Industry and Trade. In the light of these requirements, "**Bachelor's Degree in E-Commerce**" has been designed with a good blend of knowledge of computers, e-Commerce and core subjects of Commerce and Management.
5. Each semester shall consist of six paper of 100 marks each.
6. The weightage to related areas of study shall be as under:-
  - i) Computer Information Technology, Programming skills - 1800 marks
  - ii) Accountancy, Costing and Auditing - 600 marks.
  - iii) Commerce and Management - 400 marks
  - iv) Economics - 300 marks
  - v) Mathematics and Statistics - 200 marks
  - vi) Mercantile, Industrial, Corporate and Cyber Laws- 300 marks

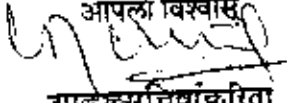
