Traditional and Propositional Logic

Section I
(Traditional Logic)

- (1) Definition, nature and scope of Logic, formal and Normative nature of Logic, Proposition and Propositional form, Argument and Argument form, truth and Validity, four fold scheme of Categorical propositions, Doctrine of distribution of terms
- (2) (a) Immediate inferences: Inference by opposition of proposition, Square of opposition, Education- conversion and obversion
(b) Mediate Inference- Categorical syllogism- Its nature and general rules.
- (3) Deductive formal fallacies: Verbal and Non verbal-
(a) Verbal- Fallacy of equivocation, Amphiboly, composition, Division, Accent, Figures of speech.
(b) Non-verbal- Fallacy of accident coverage of accident, petitio principii Ignoratio elenchi and its various forms, fallacy of many questions.
- (4) Definition: Its nature and purposes, Real and nominal definitions, Kinds of definitions- ostensive, Extensive, Biverbal, per genus et differentiam- definition, stipulative and lexical definition.

Section II
(Propositional Logic)

- (5) Nature of Proposition, Distinction between sentence and Proposition, Modern classification of propositions, symbolization of propositions, propositional variables and logical constants- Negation, Conjunction, Disjunction, Implication and Logical equivalence- Its basic truthtables.
- (6) (a) Testing Validity by truth table method
(b) Statement forms: Tautology, Contradiction and Contingency
- (7) Decision Procedure: Truth table, Shorter truth table and truth trees
- (8) Nature of deductive proof, Rules of inference, replacement etc., Direct proof.

Section I (Ethics)

- (2) Hedonism: Psychological and ethical - Egoistic and Universal, Bentham and Mill's utilitarianism, Its evaluation.
- (3) Kantian Ethics: The good will, Kant's doctrine of Categorical imperatives, postulates of morality, Duty for duties sake.
