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Rules for Admission
Post graduate Course M.D. (Ayurved)

1. GENERAL:

These rules may be called the admission to Post-graduate Course in various Ayurvedic subjects conducted at the Government Ayurvedic College and Hospitals in the State of Maharashtra Rules, 1989. These rules shall also be made applicable to grant-in-aid institutions in the State of Maharashtra.

2. ELIGIBILITY:

(a) The candidate possessing any of the qualifications mentioned in second Schedule appended to the Indian Medicine Control Council Act, 48 of 1970 and are covered under parts "A", "B", "C" and "D" of the Schedule appended to the Maharashtra Medical Practitioners Act, 1961 provided they fulfil the prescribed eligibility of the respective Universities and Government of Maharashtra as in force and as modified from time to time.

(b) Candidates applying for admission to Post-graduate course of the concerned University in Maharashtra must have registered him self/her self under the Maharashtra Medical Practitioners, Act, 1961 as amended from time to time and must produce a valid certificate therefor at the time of submitting application for admission. The concerned candidates must regularly renew the registration under the said Act during the course of their studies, failing which, the Dean shall take such action as he may deem fit, including advising the University to cancel the Registration of the candidate (Note:- this provision shall not apply to the foreign candidates nominated by the Central Government).

(c) The candidate to be eligible for the admission to the Post-graduate course must have secured a minimum of 55% of uncorrected marks in the subject of speciality for which he/she is applying. However, this condition will not be applicable for the candidates in service and reserved category candidates.

(d) the student from outside State shall have to produce - eligibility certificate from the respective University in Maharashtra as per University requirements.

3. NOTIFICATION OF SEATS:

A notification stating the number of seats at the respective Ayurved Colleges available for registration for Post-graduates Ayurveda Course in various Ayurvedic subjects will be notified by the Dean, at their respective Ayurveda Colleges in the academic year, sufficiently in advance. The notification will indicate the following particulars:-

- a) The subject-wise availability of seats.
- b) the reservation of seats for Backward Classes as prescribed Government mentioning that the category for which the seats are reserved will be given by rotation.
- c) a copy of such notification will be submitted to Government and the Directorate of Ayurved, Maharashtra State by the Dean as soon as issued by him.

4. BASIS OF SELECTION :

(a) The basis of selection for admission to the Post-graduate (Ayurveda) course in the various Ayurvedic specialities shall be on merit as judged by the marks obtained at the relevant University examination in the subject concerned duly corrected for the number of attempts/drops/gaps taken to pass the relevant examinations as a whole (i.e. final examination of the concerned) and also to pass in the subject concerned.

(b) Deduction of marks:-

- i) passing of all subjects at the first attempt - No deduction
- ii) passing of the subject concerned at first attempt & other subject at second attempt - 3% deduction
- iii) passing the subject concerned at second attempt and passing of remaining subjects at first attempt. - 4% deduction
- iv) passing the subject at second attempt and the remaining subjects at second attempt. - 5% deduction
- v) passing the subject concerned at first or second attempt and passing the remaining subject at third attempt. - 6% deduction
- vi) passing the subject concerned at third attempt or subsequent attempt and passing whole examination at fourth or subsequent attempt. - Not eligible for admission to the post-graduate Registration

(c) Rule deciding "Attempt" :

Candidates shall be deemed to have failed to pass the final examination if their names have been submitted by the Principal/Dean, of their college to the University for inclusion in the list of candidates for the examination and if they have failed to pass the examination either because they have not attained the standard of passing prescribed by the University concerned or because they have been absent from the whole or part of the examination, provided that candidates who at their first attempt after their names have been submitted the Dean, of the college to the University for inclusion in the list of the candidates appearing for the examination apply to the University through the Dean for the withdrawal of their application for admission to the examination 48 hours before the commencement thereof, shall not be deemed to have failed the examination, but shall be considered as having taken a gap or drop.

d) Gap/Drop :

A candidate who fails to appear or does not appear in the respective examination for which he/she is due to appear either on his/her own accord or for any other reason or because he/she is not given the form, is considered to have had a "GAP/DROP" for the examination and appropriate marks will be deducted as shown against the column.

e) Selection in case of equal corrected marks:

- i) first preference to candidates with higher individual subject marks without any subtraction.
- ii) If clause (i) is also equal second preference to candidates with higher total marks in final qualifying examination for admission to the Post-graduate course.

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- iii) If clauses (i) and (ii) above are equal, third preference to candidate with higher total of all the examinations of the course conducted by the University.
- iv) If clauses (i), (ii), (iii) are also equal, fourth preference to a candidate passing all the examinations at first attempt.
- v) If clauses (i) to (iv) above are equal, fifth preference to those having less number or failures/gaps/drops in all the University examinations taken together.

5. RESERVATION OF SEATS:

a) 5% seats or minimum one seat of the total seats available for registration for Post-graduate degree course in all the subjects taken together shall be reserved for the eligible candidates who pass from other institutions in Maharashtra where facilities for post-graduate studies are not available and provided his/her name appears in the merit list of selected candidates.

b) 50% of the total seats in Post-graduate degree course in all the subjects taken together for registration available in a year in each college shall be reserved for in service personnel of the Government of Maharashtra in the respective Government Ayurvedic Colleges as well as in the grant-in-aid Ayurvedic Colleges in the Maharashtra State. Out of 50% seats stated above, 25% seats should be reserved for Teacher-students in Government Ayurvedic College as well as grant-in-aid colleges in the concerned subjects. This facility is given to in-service persons the first time of admission only. At the second time, he/she should come by merit.

b-i) The percentage allotment stated in (a) above includes the Backward class personnel in the prescribed proportion i.e.

- 1. Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Castes converts to Buddhism. 13%
- 2. Scheduled Tribes including those living outside the specified areas. 7%
- 3. Denotified Tribes/Nomadic Tribes 4%
- 4. Other Backward Communities 10%

TOTAL:- 34%
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b-ii) the seats mentioned in (i) above should be made available by rotation during the year as well as every year.

c) Further, the allotment of those seats in various subject shall be made only if the outside candidates of (a) category above come in the list of selected candidate from the common merit list prepared for local and outside candidates. The candidates so selected will be given registration as per availability of registration in various subjects. There will be no guarantee of recommending registration in a particular speciality.

d) the availability of post-graduate seats will be worked out every year. After deducting seats given to categories (a) and (b) above the remaining seats shall be available for the candidates belonging to the respective institutions of open and Backward class categories.

(e) 34% of the total seats available as per (c) above for registration in all the subject taken together in a year will be reserved for Backward Classes in the prescribed proportion. This includes the students getting registration under Backward Class category under sub-rule (a) and (b) which shall be notified by the Deans of respective Ayurvedic colleges.

(f) in the event of seats for registration remaining vacant at the colleges from (a), (b), (c) and (d) categories, the vacant seats at the respective colleges will be filled in by the eligible candidates belonging to respective colleges as per merit.

6. RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR BACKWARD CLASS COMMUNITIES:

(a) the percentage of seats reserved at each college will be as follows:-

(b) 24% seats reserved for students belonging to the three categories of Backward Classes i.e. (1) Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Caste converts to Buddhism, (2) Scheduled Tribes including those living outside specified areas and (3) Denotified Tribes and Nomadic Tribes should be exclusive of the number of other students belonging to these three categories who secure admission in merit, provided that the total number of students of these three categories of Backward classes who secure admission against the 24% reserved quota and on open merit, does not exceed 40% of the total number of seats available for admission.

(c) In the event of seats out of those reserved for the first three categories mentioned (1), (2) and (3) above remain vacant for want of application from eligible candidates of a particular category, then seats so remaining vacant shall be available to the eligible candidates of the remaining categories in the mentioned above proportion of percentage prescribed for them.

(d) Students belonging to other Backward Communities mentioned in the list of Backward Classes for the whole of Maharashtra under Government Resolution, Education and Social Welfare Department No. PEC-2169-J, dated 10th July, 1969 as amended from time to time shall continue to enjoy the benefit of 10% reservation of seats for them.

(e) It is clarified for the information of all that the 10% is not an overall ceiling for the OBC candidates. It is open to the OBC candidates to secure more than 10% seats on the basis of open merit. However, if the admission they secure on merit are less than 10% there should be reservation for them to the extent of the short-fall below 10%.

(f) Candidates belonging to Backward Class communities recognised by the Government of Maharashtra and who were admitted for the courses leading to the qualification as mentioned under Rule 2-Eligibility (a) against the reserved seats for the respective groups in the Government Ayurvedic College in Maharashtra State will only be considered eligible for selection against the respective reserved seats. However, a candidate who was admitted to the courses leading to the qualification as mentioned under rule 2-Eligibility(a) against an un-reserved seat due to the fact that the community to which he/she belongs was not then declared eligible for a seat in the reserved category shall be held eligible for selection against the reserved seats for admission to the post-graduate courses in Ayurvedic subjects, if on the date of such selection the community stands included in one of the categories of the reserved seats and the candidate is otherwise eligible to avail of the concession. It is the responsibility of the concerned candidate to produce the required proof with the application as required under the rules and specific mention of his/her claim to be considered under the particular reserved category.

(g) All rules regarding "Reservation" as prescribed by the Government from time to time will be applicable.

(h) In case of any discrepancy or dispute of Caste claim, it is the responsibility of the concerned candidate to obtain from the Director of Social Welfare, Government of Maharashtra or from such authority nominated by the Government from time to time the verification of the Caste claim validity in writing and to produce the same within period of 10 days from his/her admission to the Post-graduate course.

(i) Nothing in these rules prevents an eligible candidate to compete for both reserved and un-reserved seats, as it may happen at times that there may be no applicant in the category to which the seat is earmarked and the seat may not remain vacant according to notification.

(j) Selection of Reserved seats as mentioned in rule 6(a) above shall be done first.

(k) The notification shall also mention as to which of the isolated incomparable seats will be treated as reserved seats in reserved quota is completed otherwise similarly, in case the candidates for reserved seats are not available for a group of seats, the extra reservation may also be transferred to these isolated incomparable seats referred to above.

(l) If the reserved seats are not filled in -

- i) for want of eligible candidates and
 - ii) even after the maximum number of eligible candidates from other categories (SC, ST, DT/NT) are accommodated by conversion of seats, then these vacant seats will be allotted to the open merit candidates.
- RESERVATION WILL NOT BE CARRIED FORWARD

7. RESERVATION FOR INSERVICE PERSONNEL:

A) In service personnel who possesses good records of service and conduct from the respective Deans/Principals of the colleges. In the event of eligible candidate applying in excess of the number of seats reserved for in-service personnel under 5(a)(i) the selection will be made on the basis of seniority and no weightage will be given to caste or religion. The decision of the Selection Committee in this matter will be final and binding.

B) The admission to Post-graduate course for in-service personnel in the subject of their appointment while in-service shall be on fulfillment of the following conditions namely:-

- i) that they are eligible for post-graduate course as per rules prescribed by the University and the Government from time to time.
- ii) that the University and the Government of Maharashtra allow them to take up post-graduate course while in service.
- iii) that their undergoing post-graduation training does not adversely interfere with the working of the Department if they are given leave or deputed to take up the post-graduate course, and
- iv) they continue in Government service till the completion of the course. Provided, further that, a post-graduate teacher shall not take more candidates than prescribed by University at a time and no more candidate shall be taken till such seat becomes vacant under the concern post-graduate teacher in-service candidate should obtain 'No Objection Certificate' from the competent authority.

8. SUBJECTS FOR THE POST-GRADUATE DEGREE COURSE IN AYURVEDA-

Specialities in which admission to post-graduate course Ayurveda Course are given depending on availability of seats and the recognised post-graduate teachers and other teaching facilities and University recognition:-

4. Sharir Kriya

6. Rasa-Shastra and Bhaishajya Kalpana
7. Prasuti Tantra and Striroga

12. Shalyatantra
13. Shalakyatantra

9. Admission to the Post-graduate Ayurved course will be given once a year within the permissible time limit set by the respective University.
10. (a) for the purpose of determining the number of seats to be filled in the subject under a recognised post-graduate teacher, the following procedure will be as follows or as prescribed by respective University.
- i) Maximum 2 admission per year will be given to a recognised post-graduate teacher who is a Professor subject to the condition that at no time the concerned teacher will have more than 4 active post-graduate students registered under him/her (part-I and part-II courses for the subject taken together).
 - ii) Maximum one admission per year will be given by a recognised post-graduate teacher who is a Reader/ Lecturer subject to the condition that at no time the concerned teacher will have more than 2 active post-graduate students registered under him/her (Part-I and Part-II courses taken together).

iii) If a recognised post-graduate teacher under clause(ii) is promoted to the post of Professor, registration as per clause (i) will come into force only from the immediate next academic term when the post-graduate Ayurveda admission are given, provided that Government may direct the post-graduate teacher in consultation with the Directorate of Ayurved and the University concerned to undertake an additional registration in his/her subject so as to facilitate the in-service candidates mentioned in Rule 5(b).

(b) No post-graduate teacher shall enroll candidates for discipline other than the subject of his/her speciality and no post-graduate teacher for more than one speciality at any time. In exceptional circumstances, however, if a teacher is competent to be a post-graduate teacher in more than one speciality, the total number of students enrolled under him/her at a time together will not exceed the number as mentioned in clause(a) above.

11. VACANCIES:

Seats of students whose names are intimated to be discontinued by the college to the University shall be deemed to have fallen vacant after acceptance of the recommendation of the Dean by the University and thereafter admission given according to the rules.

12. INTERVIEWS etc.:

- i) The date, place and time of the interview will be intimated to the respective candidates through an advertisement or by a letter sent under certificate of posting.
- ii) At the time of selection respective candidates will be called personally to indicate his/her preference of the subject and for the verification of the certificates. The candidate is liable to lose his/her seat if he/she fails to comply with these requirements and his/her seat will be offered to the next candidate on the merit list.

No marks would be added or deducted to the corrected marks on account of this interview.

13. (a) Display of merit list with corrected marks of all, the eligible candidates will be made on the Notice Board in the institution at least three clear working days of the college to the date of interview candidates shall not be informed individually of the merit list. It is the responsibility of the applicant to see the merit list is on the Notice Board.

(b) (i) Appeals, if any against the merit list should be made by a written application, duly signed by the aggrieved candidate only to the Dean of the institution concerned within two working days of the college from the date of declaration of the merit list.

(ii) Decisions on appeals received in time, shall be given by the Dean at least one clear working day of the office prior to the date of interview.

14. (a) Display of the selection list of the candidates and provision of appeal will be made on the Notice Board of the institution, within 24 hours after the date of selection. The selection list will include subject-wise waiting list of minimum 2 candidates prescribed or 10% whichever is more as well.

(b) Appeals if any, against the decision of the selection committee should be addressed by the concerned candidate only duly signed and in writing to the Director of Ayurved, Bombay through the Dean of the concerned college within 2 working days of the college from the date of exhibiting the selection list on the Notice Board during the working hours of the office. The decision of the Director of Ayurved, M.S. Bombay or the authority vested for the conducting the duties of Director of Ayurved will be final and binding on all concerned.

15. On a special written request to the Chairman of the Selection Committee, a candidate selected for admission to the post-graduate Ayurveda course may be given a maximum of 7 days of joining period. If after the expiry of 7 days, candidate does not pay the registration and tuition fees or does not join the course, his/her seat will be cancelled and will be offered to the next candidate on the merit list, by the Dean. The Dean will forthwith inform in writing to the University the failure of the student to join and recommend cancellation of registration.

16. SELECTION COMMITTEE:

The Committee for selection of Post-graduate students in Ayurveda (M.D. Ayurveda) shall consist of the following Members:-

- (a) Dean of respective Ayurvedic College - Chairman
- (b) Senior most graduate teachers approved by the concerned University - Member
- (c) One Professor of a different college to be nominated by Director of Ayurved. - Member

17. Terms and Conditions Governing Post-Graduate (Ayurved) Students Rules:-

1. Stipend :

Post-graduate students will be entitled to such stipend as may be fixed by Government from time to time.

(a) The stipend will be paid for completion of their regular academic two years period of post-graduate M.D. Ayurveda course. Under no circumstances he/she will receive a stipend beyond 36 months or beyond the completion of the post-graduate Ayurveda course (i.e. passing the Post-graduate Ayurveda Degree examination) whichever is earlier.

(b) Selected post-graduate candidates will receive stipend for two regular terms each of maximum six months duration each in post graduate Ayurveda Part-I course. Candidates who fail in post-graduate Ayurveda examination or those who take drop(s), gap(s) on completion of regular two terms of the post-graduate Ayurveda Part-I course will not be entitled to receive any stipend till passing the said Part-I examination.

(c) The candidates will receive the stipend for regular four terms of maximum upto six months each in post-graduate Ayurveda Part-II course, candidates who fail in post-graduate Ayurved Part-II examination or those who have to continue studies beyond the regular four term period for completion of their course or those who take drop(s), gap(s) will not be entitled to receive the stipend after their regular four terms.

(d) If it is observed that a candidate who has received the stipend during the post-graduate Ayurveda Part-I or Part-II course has discontinued his/her studies or is not completing his/her dissertation within a reasonable time after his/her regular four terms or has taken continuous two or more drops inspite of being eligible to appear for the relevant examination will be liable to refund all the stipend amount paid to him/her by the Government towards his/her post-graduate studies. In special or exceptional circumstances there would be immediate written intimation from the candidate to his/her post-graduate teacher, regarding the reason for his/her discontinuation or drop for a particular period and he/she should obtain a certificate from the Dean permitting him/her to remain absent or take a drop due to circumstances beyond control. The Dean is authorised to exercise due discretion in deserving cases, making a specific written note to this effect and to exercise due discretion in deserving cases, making a specific written note to this effect and to exercise judgement as to what period such relaxation is reasonably permissible in such case.

(e) The Dean is authorised to stop the payment of the stipend of the candidate who becomes ineligible to receive stipend due to the conditions and rules framed by the Government. Good conduct is a condition precedent for receipt of stipend and the Dean may at his discretion stop the payment of stipend if in his opinion the students conduct is not good or he/she is not maintaining proper discipline in the college or otherwise.

2. A candidate receiving any other scholarship/stipend/fellowship/financial assistance from any Trust/or any other similar financial assistance for his/her post-graduate studies will not be eligible for receipt of stipend. He/She should declare whether he/she is getting any stipend etc. from other source.

3. A candidate who is in part-time full time Government/Semi-Government/Private service or if he/she is receiving an Honorarium amount for attachment to an establishment, he/she will not be eligible to receive the stipend.

4. A candidate previously not eligible for stipend may become eligible for receipt of the said stipend at a later date if conditions for not granting him/her stipend no more exist. In such cases, Only if feasible, the Dean is authorised to grant the payment of stipend only for the balance period of the candidate's regular term. Specific written request for the stipend from the candidate and a written order from the Dean will be required prior to payment of stipend to such a candidate. Such a candidate will also be Governed by the same rules and conditions Governing payment of stipend for the full period to the eligible candidate.

5. (a) No private practice of any kind will be allowed to a candidate who is in receipt of stipend, as the post-graduate (M.D.Ayurved) course is full time study course. All the candidates in receipt of the stipend will have to give such an undertaking in writing, prior to receipt of the first stipend.

(b) If it is discovered or if it is brought to the notice of the authorities that any candidate is carrying on private practice of any kind (including private practice with some body else) and if the Dean is satisfied that such is the case, he will record the fact and the stipend of the candidate will be stopped immediately. The Dean is also authorised to issue a notice to the candidate and to get a refund of the stipend amount of the candidate who has indulged in any kind of private practice during

the period when he/she was in receipt of the stipend. If the candidate fails to comply, the Dean (with the written concurrence of the Director of Ayurved) may address a letter to the University to cancel the registration of the concerned candidate of the M.D. Ayurveda course and take recourse to such action as to recover the amount of stipend paid to the candidate. The Dean may either approach the District Collector to recover the same as arrears of land revenue and/or approach the Registrar of Maharashtra.

(c) Cheating the Government by any candidate by wrongful declaration or by receiving the stipend while doing private practice or while receiving other financial assistance for post-graduate course by way of scholarship/stipend etc. will make the candidate liable to have his/her name struck-off from the post-graduate course with the concurrence of the University.

6. LEAVE:

Leave as admissible to selected post-graduate students getting stipend will be as follows:-

(i) Maximum of 10 days leave during post-graduate Ayurveda course Part-I course with stipend. This leave cannot be accumulated for the purpose of being utilised at a stretch nor can it be carried forward to the subsequent year.

(ii) Maximum 15 days leave during Post-graduate Ayurveda Part-II course with stipend Governed by the same rule as in (i) above.

(iii) Leave with stipend as above will be granted under written intimation to the Dean, by the concerned, post-graduate teacher for grant of such leave with stipend. The Dean will cease his office to maintain a leave record of the post-graduate students.

(iv) The post-graduate students will not be entitled to any other leave with stipend such as casual leave, optional leave compensatory leave or leave on medical ground.

7. VACATIONS:

The post-graduate students will avail a half of the University vacations as directed by the post-graduate teacher under whom they are registered. Those post-graduate students who have appeared for the University examination, however, can avail of the rest of that vacation on conclusion of the University examination or as decided by the concerned post-graduate teacher considering the schedules of studies. The period of vacation will not be included for the purpose of leave mentioned in 6(i),(ii) above.

8. CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINARY MATTERS:

(a) Post-graduate students will be governed by the regular procedure, rules and disciplines of the departments in which they study and they must abide by the instructions of their post-graduate teacher and also of the Head of the Department and those of the University.

(b) The post-graduate students must keep the required attendance in clinics, lectures, Seminars etc. in each term as term is required by the University and as informed to them by the post-graduate teacher under whom they are registered.

(c) All the candidates must return the library books, instruments of the department, other departmental items, keys of the lockers and any other items of the department/institution/other institutions, within 7 days, from the conclusion of their respective post-graduate Ayurved Part-I & II University examination. The names of those candidates who do not return all the above mentioned items within the stipulated period and those who do not make good the loss of those items as directed by the Head of the Department or the Dean, will be communicated to the University for necessary action and their examination results may be withheld and necessary recovery proceedings duly instituted for the misconduct.

(d) It is the full responsibility of the post-graduate students to take care of the books, instruments, journals and other departments/institutional items allotted to him/her or used by him/her for post-graduate studies or clinical work.

(e) The post-graduate student who discontinues the post-graduate Ayurveda course prior to passing the post-graduate Ayurveda Part-I and/or post-graduate Ayurveda Part-II examinations and those who continuously remain absent without any intimation and due permission for more than 2 months must return all the books, instruments and institutional items etc. as mentioned above to the department/institution immediately within 7 days of the due intimation given to them in the matter.

(f) The post-graduate students will have to pay the caution money Deposit, Library Deposit or any such necessary deposits approved by the Dean from time to time which will be duly communicated to the candidates at the time of admission or during the course if necessary.

(g) The post-graduate students will be governed by such other rules and conditions stipulated by the Government from time to time and also by the rules and disciplines of the department/institution in which they study.

(h) Any serious misconduct on the part of any post-graduate students or discrepancy in the discharge of duties during the post-graduate Ayurveda course, if pointed out by the post-graduate teacher/Head of the Department, the Dean will make the candidate liable to disciplinary action including removal of the post-graduate student from pursuing further post-graduate, Ayurveda course under intimation to the University.

(i) A post-graduate student having been selected for particular branch and having accepted the same, cannot apply for registration in any other branch until he/she passes the post-graduate Ayurveda Part-II examination. This change is not permitted even if he/she does not receive any stipend during the study period. If such incidence is noticed by Government the defaulter will be liable to pay a penalty of Rs.10,000/- to Government.

(j) The registration once granted is valid only if the teacher and the Dean are satisfied about the regularity, and pursuit of studies by the student as well as his/her good conduct worthy of a student of the college and the University. The Dean in consultation with the teacher and the staff committee may recommend, de-registration of a post-graduate student to the University for irregularity and/or misconduct, such decisions shall be reported to the Director of Ayurved, Bombay and appeal, if any, shall be sent by the concerned post-graduate student to the Director of Ayurved, Bombay (within 15 days on receiving such intimation) whose decision will be final and binding. All post-graduate students registered shall have to sign an "Agreement" to this effect.

18. POWERS OF THE DEAN:

The Dean of the concerned Ayurvedic college is empowered to take decision on matter if any, not covered by these rules with the written concurrence of the Director of Ayurved, Bombay or his authorised nominee/representative.

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
