Sir,

In accordance with decision taken by the University authorities, I have been directed to inform you that at the time when the syllabus was prepared, it was assumed that all the Colleges would necessarily be in possession of the copies of the Anthology of the Prose of the Romantic Age (published by the University of Poona, 1968). However, it is learnt that several Colleges do not have this edition of the above mentioned text. These Colleges, however, do possess the revised, smaller edition of 1976 (Editors - Prof. M.G. Deshpande, Prof. S.R. Purohit and Prof. S.G. Desai). In the light of this situation, the following essays have been prescribed :-

- 1) William Godwin - Appendix of Co-operation  
Co-habitation and Marriage.
- 2) Mary Wollstoncraft - Vindication of the Rights of Woman.
- 3) Charles Lamb - i) Dream Children.  
ii) Imperfect Sympathies.
- 4) William Hazlitt - On the Ignorance of the Learned.

The essays prescribed above can be found in both the editions of The Prose of the Romantic Age published by the University of Poona (1968 and 1976 editions).

The following essays included in the earlier part of the syllabus are deleted.

- i) The Age of Reason.
- ii) The Pains of Opium.

The titles of the essays included in the text is Reading for Pleasure (Second year B.A. Second Term). In this regard I also hereby inform you that since the text Reading for Pleasure, prescribed for the Second Term (S.B.A. (S.Y.B.A. Compulsory English) is in the press and may take some more time to come out, I am sending the information regarding the titles of the essays, their authors and the books from where they have been taken. This information is for convenience the teachers teaching compulsory English to S.Y.B.A. Class till such time the text comes out.
