Advice, persuasion, catharsis, Rogerian nondirective therapy, group therapy, play therapy. Psychoanalysis ; Freudian Psycho analysis, evaluation of Psychoanalysis.
6. Introduction to Psychoses symptomatology classification, general factors, some popular misconceptions, senile psychosis, general symptomatology, clinical types, etiological and predisposing factors.
7. Manic Depressive Psychoses etiological & Predisposing factors, manic phases, depressive phase, involutional melancholia and paranoid general paresis, senile Psychoses (only).

8. Alcoholic mental disorders and Epilepsy Why people drink, general effects of alcohol type of alcoholic Psychoses, treatment & prognosis Epilepsy Types epilepsy, symptoms causal factors and treatment of epilepsy Drug addition.
9. Mental deficiency General characteristics, degree of deficiency, classification, etiological and predisposing factors, clinical types, idiots, savants, treatment & prognosis.
10. Somatic Therapies - Shock treatment, ICT, ECT, drug therapies, Mental hygiene, principles of mental hygiene.
