METHODOLOGY OF SOCIAL SCIENCES

- Objective : 1) To introduce the students the methodology and techniques used in social sciences.
- 2) To get them acquainted with the methodological issues involved in Social Sciences.

I - Term

1. Nature of Social Sciences as distinguished from Natural Sciences. Nature of research in Social Sciences. Recent trends in Social Science research.
2. Approaches to explaining human behaviour-Positivistic and Non-Positivistic.
3. Concepts : Their role in scientific investigation and development of social sciences.
4. Hypothesis : Nature and role of hypothesis in social science. Conditions of good hypothesis.

II - Term

5. Field observation-Participant and non-participant observation.
6. Questionnaire and Schedule as aids in social exploration. Interview technique use of case data in social sciences.
7. Use of statistical procedures and the possibility and extent of experimentation in social sciences.
8. Planning a research project, selection of research problem guiding considerations in the analysis of data and report writing.

Entrepreneurship Development

Section - I

2. Forms of business organisation, sole proprietorship partnership - joint stock companies, cooperatives. Role of entrepreneurship in developed and developing economies.

2. Input-output devices:-  
Punched card, papertape VDU, magnetic tape, magnetic disk floppy disk, Hard disk, winchester disk keyboard etc.
3. Concept of programming Language.  
machine language, high level language, Assembly language.  
Concept of assembler, Interpreter, Compiler.
4. Flow chart techniques.
5. Introduction to operating system & some useful DOS Commands.  
(CHKDSK, CLS, COPY, DIR, DISK, COPY, FORMAT, SYS, TIME, TYPE, DATE) (Use of Computer is expected 2 hour.)
6. Introduction to word processing (with actual Demonstration on computer) (3 hours.)

- (1) Getting started with Basic :- Character set, variable, constants, operators, Expression, INPUT - output statements, READ - DATA Statements, END Statement, STOP Statement, Stop Statement (many programming examples should be taken)
- (2) Branching & Looping :- Relational operators, GOTO, IF-THEN ON, GOTO, IF-THEN, ON-GOTO Statements, FOR-NEXT loops, NESTED- loops.
- (3) Library function, Function Statement, subroutine GOSUB Statement, subroutine GOSUB Statement.
- (4) Introduction to file handling (DATA file)
- (5) Some of Graphic Commands.
- (6) Use of BASIC Interpreter ( actual demonstration on computer is expected.)
